Sport

On Tuesday 18th June Year 5 went sailing at the WPNSA in Portland. They had a fabulous time in the sunshine learning lots of new skills and taking part in kayaking, giant paddle boarding and sailing in groups of 2 or 3 in lightweight sailing boats. They learnt how to navigate, steer and how to use the wind to propel them across the water. All the children learnt new skills and how to work as a team during the day. As per an email that has been sent previously, the Andrew Simpson Centre offers many different activities for children from the age of 5. It is certainly an activity that all children remember even when they are at Secondary School.

Thursday 27th June saw 16 of our year 3/4/5/6 pupils attending the Quadkids Athletics Tournament at Beaminster School. The year 3/4 had to run in a 50m sprint, 400m distance run, standing long jump and a vortex howler throw. Year 5/6 had a 70m sprint, 600m distance run, standing long jump and vortex howler throw. Both groups of pupils ran in a shuttle relay where they really excelled. A special mention to Reggie who came 3rd overall for the year 5/6 boys running 70m in 10.89 seconds and 600m in 2 minutes 13 seconds. Korbin deserves a special mention for his magnificent howler throw of 28.43m. Arienne came 1st overall in her year 3/4 sprint running it in 7.64 seconds and was the 2nd overall winner of the year 3/4 girls. Holly R jumped a magnificent 1.82m in the standing long jump and threw 21.49m with the howler. Holly R came 1st out of all the year 3/4 girls with 279 points only 3 points above Arienne. Two excellent athletes. Caitlyn came 3rd overall in the year 5/6 girls scoring 172 points just 7 points behind the leader. She also threw the furthest in her year group throwing 24.45m and jumping 1.63m. These are just a few of our fabulous results from our superb athletes who definitely uphold all our school and sporting values.

Friday 28th June saw the whole school out on the field taking part in our wonderful sports day. All children ran superbly and KS1 took part in a fabulous obstacle course race. Year 6 as per usual had a water race and thoroughly enjoyed getting each other and members of staff

and parents very wet! Equality were the overall winners and Korbin and Harris received the shield for their team.

This will be the last sports update that I will write after a fantastic 30 years at Parrett & Axe. I am so proud of all our children who take part in so many events and tournaments. We are a school that is known for its sporting prowess and the amount of cups and shields we win. This is all down to pupils past and present who embrace our values and Christian ethos. My mantra has always been, I don't mind where you come first, second or last, it's the taking part that counts. As I write this we are still waiting to hear as to whether we have achieved the platinum level award for schools that we are so proud to have achieved since 2016. Meals can be ordered, changed or cancelled 7 days in advance.

All Corfe and Chesil Key Stage 1 children are entitled to free school meals under the Government Universal Infant Free School Meals Scheme. Meals for Key Stage 2 children are very reasonable at £2.50 each.

Please log in to your LFL account and check that meals have been ordered and that you have noted the days where you need to send a packed lunch for your child. If you have any problems ordering meals during the holidays, please contact Local Food Links they will have staff that can help you.
